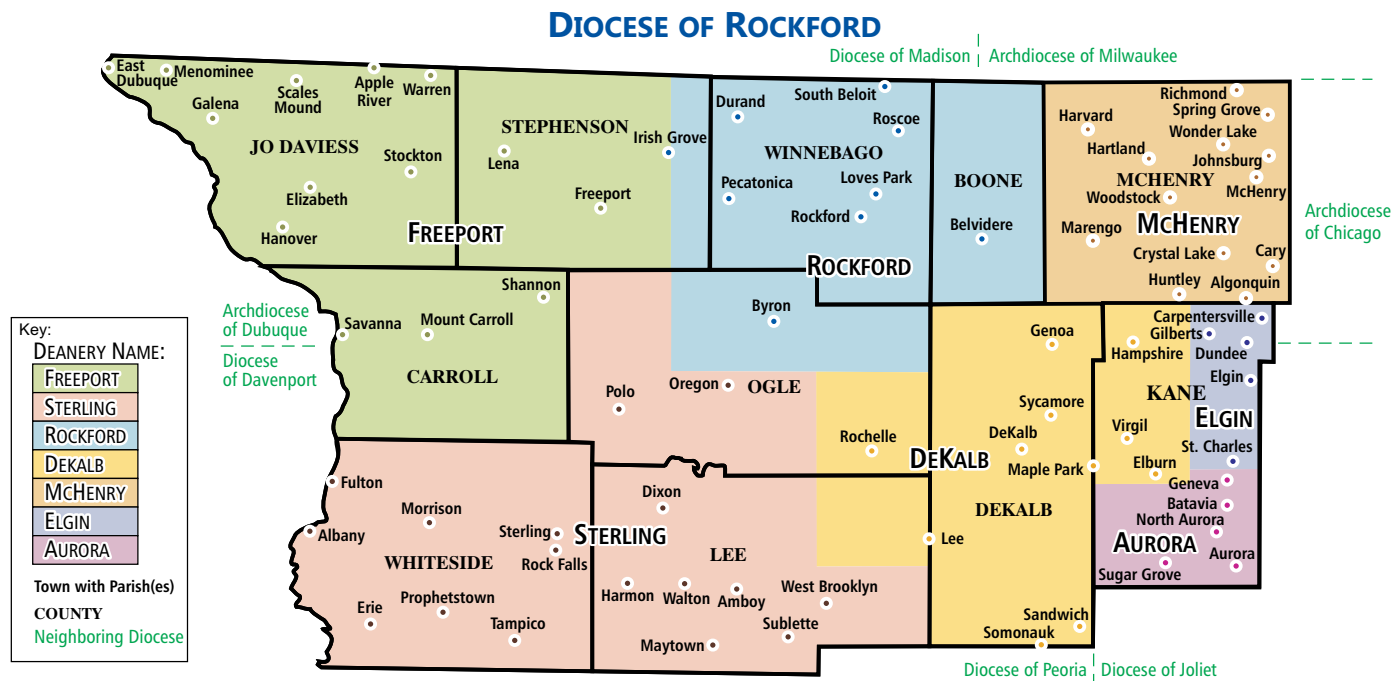




MARKET COVERAGE REACH THE CATHOLIC MARKET IN THE DIOCESE OF ROCKFORD



The Observer is the official newspaper of the Diocese of Rockford, Illinois. It was established in 1935 and serves more than 400,000 Catholics. It comprises 11-counties in the Northern Illinois area, ranging from the far northwest and southwest Chicago suburbs along the Fox River on the east to the Mississippi River west; from the Wisconsin state line on the north to the southern borders of DeKalb, Kane, Lee, and Whiteside Counties. Catholics represent approximately 26% of the total population within the Rockford Diocese.

- The Observer is published weekly, on Fridays, as per dates listed on our Advertising Schedule/Editorial Calendar page. Also, the digital edition of The Observer is posted online every Thursday.
- It is delivered by direct-mail to well over 58,000 readers* in approximately 25,000* households.
