The range of activity with THP/LCS is wide--very wide. In Haiti, it was a tougher day at St. Louis de Gonzague for the Louverture Basketball Team. In our first game with our esteemed brother school, we lost, but played well. We have already set a re-match for November. It was still a victory for the formalization of our sports program and the continuation of our growing relationship with SLG.

Having proven no hole is deep enough, the Volunteers have taken on "The Pile" of all piles. This is material that has been amassed from the walls that fell in the earthquake and from the first renovation project. It is our goal to re-use all the material in one manner or the other. To make this possible, the various types of debris have to be sorted into piles. The pictured pile was twice the size it is today—and it will be half *this* size soon. Many visitors to the school have had the pleasure of sorting the rock pile--this is the Olympic event. The taming of the pile removes another reminder of the earthquake--we are happy to see it brought into order.

Graduation is Saturday. We are looking forward to it! More on that next week.
