Community Update: The Last Wall

Before leaving for Easter break, we decided to work one last job. The first pictures show the concrete wall that separates the school from the alley. It was the last wall on campus that had to be taken down. The bottom right photo shows the current wall on which is painted Luke 17:33. (“Whoever seeks to preserve his life will lose it, but whoever loses it will save it.”)

In continuing service to those affected by the earthquake, we recently partnered with Catholic Relief Services, St. Francois de Sales (a Port-au-Prince Diocesan hospital), the Haiti Memphis Medical Mission, and St. Charles Seminary to establish a “step-down hospital” for the injured who need follow-up care. The Haitian Project will provide a pilot program, led by Shiller Joseph (’98 LCS Grad) to assist patients in finding the medical attention they need. This is yet another program that places our graduates in working roles behind the help that Haiti needs.

We are proud to announce the new position of Minel Lofficial (’05 LCS Grad). He will be leaving his post as the Director of Operations for our Office of External Affairs and moving up to Project Coordinator for the Canadian Red Cross. Minel has always been and will continue to be a great asset to THP/LCS. I will miss seeing him all day, but I am sure that I will still see him almost every day. I am always proud when an LCS graduate moves up in his or her career--even if it means out of LCS. Now is a time when we have to give some of our best people to help

other organizations succeed in their missions and help the country to recover. So, it is a bit sad for the moment, but it's what is best.
