
ne day, while the apostles were worshipping and fasting, the Holy Spirit told them something.

"Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them," the Holy Spirit said.

Barnabas and Saul — who became known as Paul — received a blessing from their friends before leaving on their first missionary journey to preach about Jesus in gentile cities. The gentiles were non-Jews who believed in false gods.

When they preached in Iconium, which is located in present-day Turkey, they converted many gentiles and even some Jews to Christianity. After a while, the Jews living in Iconium who did not believe in Jesus made people mad at Paul and Barnabas. The two men fled the city before they could be killed.
